




OAK CREEK VILLAGE GARDEN CLUB TRIP 4TH TUESDAY - FEBRUARY 25, 2014

This month I wanted to return my column to the most important aspect of my Department. The Harris County Pct. 4 Constable's Office was built on one simple concept. That concept is community based policing. This philosophy is almost as old as the office of Constable itself, rooted in the old world beat cops who walked the streets in a certain area. Even the term "COP" is based on Constable on Patrol.

In today's community based policing organization it is far more challenging and requires a cooperative agreement and relationship between law enforcement and its citizens. By having the same patrolmen in the same area they get to know the residents, good and bad, and from there have the true pulse of a community. By watching the area youth grow up, the youth are for more likely to confide in the deputy and when needed, even ask for assistance.

With this said it is imperative to engage your deputies and get to know them. Let them know about your concerns and suspicions. Attend your neighborhood meetings where in many cases you can share these concerns. In today's world of technology we are all too often caught up awaiting a social media update. There is no substitute for conversation and real interaction. Without you, the community, your deputies are only able to act on half of the information.

In closing, let me assure you that Constable Hickman and his staff are firmly committed to serving your needs and can exceed your expectations when we all work together for a safer community.



JANUARY 14, 2014

The meeting was called to order by President Sharon Kuester. Members present were Sharon, Ron Halk, Tim Cooley, Lloyd Bratton, Elizabeth Davis, AJ Salinas and Jon Whisler. A small group of residents also attended.

The minutes of the December 10, 2013 meeting had to be amended due to the inadvertent omission of the Treasurer's report to the minutes. However, the reports were carried in the newsletter. Also, our Security Letter and Ballot was to be referred to our attorney to be revised, if necessary, and approved by him. The minutes were approved as amended.

REPORTS

Maintenance -

Written report read and approved.

Architectural Control -

Oral report accepted. The homeowner concerned about his fence due to the upcoming pipeline work, will be relieved to know that it may not be moved at all. If it has to be moved, it will be restored to its original site.

Lou Bernard announced the result of the Election to increase our Security. We received 135 votes in favor of the increased security and 45 votes against. Tim Cooley, on behalf of the Board, thanked Lou for all her work on the ballot and the election.

Security -

Lloyd presented the Sheriff's report and thanked the voters for their approval of an additional deputy. He mentioned that there was only 1 report of a stolen vehicle...a very quiet month. Report accepted.

Recreation -

Written report read and approved. A motion to approve continuing the \$1.00 charge for pool passes through the 2014 season was passed.

Deed Restrictions -

Oral report accepted.

Treasury -

Written reports read and approved.

NEW BUSINESS

Dan Linehan presented an original new design to replace the monuments at our entrances. Residents have requested viewing some more presentations.

Meeting adjourned at 8:50 p.m.


OAK CREEK VILLAGE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION MAINTENANCE REPORT

Balance Sheet

The November 30th, 2013 balance sheet shows \$653,538 in the bank.

Statement of Revenue & Expense

For November 2013, revenue was below budget by (\$117) primarily due to lower Transfer Fee income. Expenses were above budget by (\$3,052) with the overage mainly being Security and Clubhouse / Ground Repairs expense.

Transaction report

We had our normal operating expenses in the month of November along with \$3,160.90 for new Christmas decorations for the subdivision entrances.

Additional Notes:

Our 2014 Maintenance Fee was mailed out at the end of last month and is due in the amount of \$272. If for some reason, you have not received your bill, checks should be made out to OCV Community Association, Inc. or contact our accountant at 281-351-2010 to make payment arrangements. Our mailing address is P.O. Box 1052, Cypress, TX 77410. This address is used for all formal correspondence and is checked by our accountant several times a week.

I have reviewed and signed the 2014 contract with Aqua-Rec and forwarded the monthly budget worksheet to the accountant. Rates increased slightly as expected.

I have obtained two quotes for the pool deck resurfacing. Please see attached. I will obtain one more quote to present to the board. After we select the contractor, I'd like to schedule the work to be done in March.

I have received a quote for new pool passes. They are .75 each plus tax, same as last year. I would like to order 1200 in two colors for 2014 and 2015.

We charge residents \$5 for per tennis court key because that's what it costs to have copies made. As it costs us approximately \$1 per pool passes, I'm requesting approval to have residents pay the \$1 this year as we did last year.

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
