


Treasury -



Additional Notes:

- I am making a motion to accept a 3% increase to the annual Maintenance Fee bringing the amount to \$280 for 2015.
- I am also making a motion to accept a 1% increase to the security fee in 2015 that is being charged by Bammel UD on our behalf which will increase the fee from \$28.50 to \$28.75 (0.9% increase).
- Our 2015 Maintenance Fee will be mailed out at the end of this month and will be due in the amount of \$280.
