

Tips from Klein Volunteer Fire Department: Spring Safety Tips



Spring time is finally here! It's now time for outdoor cooking and yard work. Here are some tips to help make your outdoor activities safer this year.

Outdoor Cooking

- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid.
 Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- An easy way to start a charcoal grill is to use a charcoal chimney starter using newspaper as fuel.
- When you are finished grilling on a charcoal grill, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.
- Before using a propane grill, check all connections for proper fit and bottle integrity.





Outdoor Equipment

- Make sure all lawn mowers, edger's, weed eaters, trimmers, etc. are in good working order for the season.
- Use eye and ear protection while operating machinery.
- Keep children and pets at a safe distance while operating outdoor equipment.
- Add fuel before starting the engine, not when it is running or hot.
- Fuel should be stored in approved containers, away from ignition source. An outdoor shed is the ideal location for fuel storage.
- If equipment is electric powered, use approved extension cords that are safe for operation.

TEXAS GOVERNOR GREG ABBOTT issued a proclamation on March 9 of this year naming 96 Texas counties where "exceptional drought conditions pose a threat of imminent disaster." The proclamation goes on to state that these drought conditions "pose an imminent threat to public health, property and the economy." Thankfully Harris County was not on the list but this proclamation should serve at least to remind everyone that water is a limited resource that should never be wasted. Beginning in 2010 and still continuing, the lack of adequate rainfall in the state has caused significant decline in reservoir and aquifer levels. Water for Harris County comes from reservoirs and aquifers. Just keep in mind that water shortages have occurred here and it could happen again. Please determine to be a water saver rather than a water splurger.

OAK CREEK VILLAGE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES

April 14, 2015

The meeting was called to order at 7:35 by President Sharon Kuester. Board members present were Sharon, Lloyd Bratton, Tim Cooley, Elizabeth Davis, Nick Fava, and Jon Whisler. Residents present were Kaylee and Brittany Bradshaw, Kathleen Phillips, Lou Bernard, Jeff Ewalt, and Bill Taylor.

The minutes of the March 10th meeting were read and approved as read. Jon presented the Treasurer's report, and commented that we were preparing to file liens on the properties of residents who were many years behind on their maintenance assessments. His report was approved.

Lloyd presented the Sheriff's report and noted that although there were two break-ins in the previous month, Oak Creek is the safest subdivision in the area, not in small part due to our diligent deputies. His report was approved.

Tim reported that he had approved some house paintings, and forwarded two inquiries on the web site to the appropriate director.

Elizabeth presented estimates she had received for the replacing of the fence at the side of the park. After some discussion, it was decided that she should get some additional estimates for options discussed and her report was approved.

Lou Bernard reported on activities of the Deed Restrictions committee and noted that they would be concentrating on boats and trailers stored in driveways. Someone brought up the issue of loose dogs, and one resident confessed that her dog was an egregious offender. She apologized and enumerated all she had done to contain the dog, saying she thought she finally had the problem solved.

Nick had no report, since he was new to the Board, but initiated discussion of the finishing of the pipeline project. One issue was the placement of the new fence between the park-swimming pool area and the water towers. The issue was solved to the satisfaction of all, and, since there was no further business, the meeting adjourned at 9:10.

It is a very good idea to have these removed in order to prevent damage to your home or roof. This is a good time to trim bushes and clean flower beds while the weather is still cool.
