

School is out. Please drive the 20 mile per hour speed limit because little ones will be outside playing and walking to the park and the pool. We have also asked that our Sheriff on duty be diligent in ticketing those who drive through the neighborhood at a greater speed than 20 miles an hour. We have had many complaints and the Sheriffs are on the lookout, especially on Gladebrook, Falling Creek and Parkville.

While driving down Falling Creek I noticed that some of the homes on this block where there have been new streets and curbs added the curbs no longer have the house number on them for emergency and visitors to find your homes. Please make arrangements to have new numbers added to the front curb of your homes. The HOA paid for all homes to have curb numbers about a year ago. Unfortunately, now these have been removed. I have the name of the gentleman who did this work for us last year. Give me a call and I will be happy to share his number with you.

Just a reminder to everyone how fortunate we are to have the security we have in our neighborhood. A news report on television this past week showed the areas that are crime infested. We are very lucky to have the Sheriff's security in our subdivision along with neighborhood watch. Remember to keep your car doors locked, remove everything of value from your car when you go inside your home and keep your doors locked at night. Keep a light on your front porch and if possible on your garage to shine on your driveway at night. At our last meeting our Security Director provided us with a report from the Sheriff's department of crimes in the area. We were fortunate to have the least amount in our subdivision. Worth every penny. Next time you see one of our Sheriff's in the neighborhood thank them or give them a thumbs up as they drive by. Also, thank our Security Director, Lloyd Bratton who does a great job and maintains a great relationship with our Sheriffs.

If you are a new resident, please give me a call so that I can drop off a Welcome Packet and hopefully answer any questions you might have regarding Deed Restrictions. Please realize that we have an active Deed Restriction committee and when you receive a notice or several notices posted on your front door it is because there are violations that need to be addressed. If you need some additional time to take care of these violations, please let us know. At no time do we wish to have any hard feelings or confrontation with any resident with a member of our Deed Restriction committee. They are all volunteers who take the time away from their families to help out and make a difference in the quality of our neighborhood. Most of the violations posted usually have no cost to them, just time and effort on the part of the resident. If you rent a home, please check with the homeowner to see whose responsibility it is to take care of certain items at the home, i.e. yard, bushes, trees trimmed, driveway, mold, swimming pool, broken windows, shudders and paint, all items that are listed in our Deed Restrictions on our website www. OakCreekVillage.org

At our Annual Meeting last month we had some residents stop by and introduce themselves. They told us that they as well as maybe 8 more residents in our neighborhood are volunteer firemen and are interested in getting involved in the neighborhood. We would like to reach out to these residents. OAK CREEK VILLAGE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION RECREATION REPORT

May 9, 2017 - Submitted by Elizabeth Davis

We experienced some problems with our new pool pump system. The motor was removed and tested under warranty and found to be working properly. The electrical was re-examined by the electrician who did the install as well as Sam Elliott. The installing electrician believed the problem was the starter switch and replaced it with a new switch. OCV was not billed for this repair. Sam Elliott reported that he feels the breaker switch the new system was wired to is loose in the box and not sitting tightly in its place. However, the installing electrician as well as the representative from Olympic Pools did not report this as an issue.

I was advised that it would be a good idea to install a ventilation fan in the pump building to prevent it getting too hot which can trigger the safety switch to trip and turn the pump motor off.

Pool passes are being issued. I have filled requests from approximately 60 families and have about that many waiting to be filled.

Gun Safety TIPS

JUNE is National Gun Safety Month!

Precinct 4 Constable Mark Herman would like to remind gun owners about the importance of firearm

safety especially when children are in the home. It is the gun owner's most important responsibility to keep their firearms safely stored and in a location where they are out of the reach of small children. Knowing and practicing gun safety is not only crucial in preventing injuries and the tragic loss of a loved one; it is the law.

There are several GUN SAFETY rules that parents should follow and devices to aid in storing your firearm:

- 1) Always store guns in a locked location, unloaded, out of the reach and sight of children.
- 2) Always store ammunition in a separate locked location, out of the reach and sight of children.
- 3) Keep the keys and combinations hidden.
- When a gun is not in its lockbox, keep it in your line of sight.
- **5)** Make sure all guns are equipped with effective, child-resistant gun locks.
- 6) If a visitor has a gun in a backpack, briefcase, handbag or an unlocked car, provide them with a locked place to hold it while they are in your home.
- 7) Leaving guns on a nightstand, table, or other place where a child can gain access may lead to injuries and fatalities.
- 8) Explain to your children how a gun that they might see on television or a video game is different from a gun in real life. "A gun, in real life, can really hurt people."
- 9) Teach your children to never touch a gun and immediately tell an adult if they see one.
- 10) Talk to grandparents and parents of the friends that your children visit about gun safety storage practices.


