

The new "Deed Restrictions Strictly Enforced - No Soliciting" signs have been posted at 9 locations and entrances. Our wonderful neighbors Ed Gutierrez and Darrel Johnson put all of these signs up for us at the 9 locations. We couldn't have done it without them. Please take a moment to check out the new signs. It is so wonderful to have these folks helping out in the neighborhood. By the way, if anyone comes to your door to solicit, please remind them that soliciting is not allowed. If they argue with you, tell them to see the signs posted throughout the neighborhood.

Renovation of the entrance walls on Falling Creek and Gladebrook will begin within the next couple of weeks. I can't wait for their completion and the new look. Once these walls are completed we will begin to make decisions regarding the entrance on Falling Creek along with a message board and the message boards on Gladebrook and Brightwood.

Good news! The tennis courts are being repaired and will soon be ready for us to use. Contact our recreation director, Elizabeth Davis, to obtain a key to the court if you wish to play tennis. We also purchased two new benches for the tennis courts, which are much nicer and sturdier than the ones we had before. We removed the picnic table that was falling apart and some of the playground equipment that was not safe for children to play on. Additional improvements are also being done to the park. We are hoping to install a fence around the park in the very near future and are also in the process of getting a mosquito-spraying system installed in the park and around the swimming pool area. People, when you use the park, please remember to throw any trash in the trash containers next to the tennis courts before you leave. Let's keep this area a nice place for us to gather and our children to play.

Residents' names, addresses, and phone numbers for our new 2017 Directory will soon be sent to the printer, but it's not too late to get yourself listed. Phone me or drop your information off at 15226 Parkville.

We are seeing lots of new driveways and windows being installed at homes and yards being spruced up. Again, thank you so much, residents. Things are looking so much nicer.

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# OAK CREEK VILLAGE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES

#### **APRIL 11, 2017**

The meeting was called to order at 7:40 p. m. by Anthony J. Salinas. All Board members were present, as were residents John Bradford, Tori-Love Merryman, Anne Alberts, Penny Johnson, Christi Gutierrez, Marilyn Bogle, and Carl and Lucy Brookshire. The minutes of the March meeting were read and approved, followed by a discussion of access to the entrance walls, which are due to be refurbished.

Elizabeth Davis reported that the Spring Fling was good, but the 5K was canceled due to lack of support. The Board discussed the problem of trash and unsupervised kids in the park, with no solutions offered.

Darrel Johnson said he is in discussion with Mosquito Nix to cover our park and pool with their system. He will get more details and e-mail the Board for a vote. He also will discuss with Don Miller, our landscaping contractor, issues of overgrown plantings and additional mowing. Also discussed were the new park benches purchased by Marilyn Bogle, and possible injury situations in the playground equipment. His report was approved.

Lloyd Bratton presented the Security report, which showed another quiet month. Our only issue is petty theft from people who do not lock their cars. School children tampering with mailboxes and managing traffic during road repairs were also discussed. Lloyd's report was approved.

Jon Whisler presented the Treasurer's report and the budget for 2017. Both were approved with the correction of the pool contract being \$37,000. Jon also gave us the finalized plan for correcting the drainage issues on Gladebrook, as agreed to by the water board, KB Homes and the affected residents.

At this point Sharon Kuester made a motion to approve the contract for the tennis court repairs totaling \$9,140. This motion was approved, as was another, also made by Sharon, to approve \$2,000 for the updating of our website. Our webmaster, Don Bundick, will attend our next meeting to hear our suggestions for the update.

The meeting adjourned at approximately 9:40 p. m.
