

OAK CREEK VILLAGE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION DEED RESTRICTION REPORT

New residents: we wanted to inform you that J&S Trash Service provides trash pick up to our residents. Trash collection is on Tuesdays and Fridays. Recycling is collected on Fridays. Please do not set out trash or recycling before 7:00 a.m. on those days. Remember we have "backdoor" trash service, but yard and waste and recycling must be hauled to the curb. Once they pick up your trash, please remove your trash cans from your driveway and put them behind your fence until the next scheduled pick up. Also it is the responsibility of our residents to pay for their trash service. J&S Trash Service can be reached at 713-635-2500. A bill is sent to residents every three months. Please remember it is a violation to have a driveway filled with trash, trash cans, broken down trucks, trailers, cars, boats, campers, etc. There should be nothing visible on your driveway but vehicles. We ask everyone to sweep their driveways as well.

Occasionally, a resident doesn't appreciate being reminded that he is violating deed restrictions. Please understand that you chose to live in an HOA subdivision, and must, therefore, abide by the deed restrictions. It is not fair to those homeowners who make an effort to keep their homes in good condition and appreciate having a HOA Board that is active and will continue to enforce the rules that keep our subdivision a safe and lovely place to live. Conforming to standards also adds to the value of your home and subdivision. You will notice that any subdivision that does not have an HOA or management company will decay and exemplify the "Broken Window Theory." (Look this up on the internet to see what it implies). Not a good image. Take a minute and go outside across the street from your home. Then, turn around and look at your house and see if it meets deed restrictions and you are proud of how it looks. A good way to start the New Year is to resolve never to have a deed restriction notice posted on your door.

Anyone in the neighborhood considering an exterior remodeling project, please don't forget to apply for approval before starting your project. Contact our Architectural Control Director, A. J. Salinas or Bill Taylor, his assistant.

Thanks to all of you who have really put for effort to take care of your home and property. We are seeing homes with new roofs, yards maintained, fences replaced or repaired, newly painted, replaced or repaired mailboxes, shutters replaced or repaired, new windows installed, mold removed and pine needles removed from roofs, walkways, and driveways. Thank you, thank you, thank you.

At our last HOA meeting we were informed that the North Harris County Regional Water Authority rates will increase as of April, 2016. We have invited the Regional Director of NHCRWA to come to our February HOA meeting, Tuesday, February 9, 2016 to speak with our residents about the reason for and what the increase will be. We encourage all of you who wish to learn about this increase to attend this meeting.

Hope all had a safe and happy holiday season. Look forward to making a difference in 2016 and again, thank you for being responsible neighbors.


